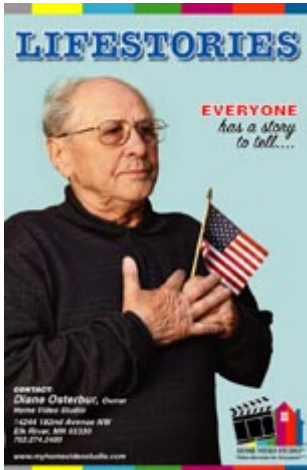


Honoring Thy Parents
